Two suspects charged in Wendy's slayings, robbery

NEW YORK — Two men accused of the execution-style slayings of five people during a robbery at a Wendy's restaurant — one of the most shocking crimes in recent New York memory — were charged yesterday with multiple counts of

yesteraly with murapie counts of murder, attempted murder, robbery and weapons possession. Queens Assistant District Attorney Greg Lasak described in chilling detail how John Taylor, 36, and Craig Godineaux, 30, allegedly

bound and gagged their victims with duct tape, then executed them one by one.

"They were marched single file told to get on their knees, and they were each shot by the defendants once in the bead." Lasak said, his

voice filled with emotion.

Lasak told Queens Criminal
Court Judge Michael Aloise that the
defendants had given videotaped
statements admitting the shootings

at the fast-food restaurant in Queens last Wednesday night. In addition, ache said, witnesses picked them out ay of a police lineup, and detectives try seized money, a security tape from of the restaurant's camera and other

"The evidence we have to tie these defendants to the case is overwhelming." Lasak said. All seven people shot were employees of the restaurant. Five were cilled and two survived with

killed and two survived with wounds, one of them by playing dead until the bandits left. Richard Rrown has 120 days to decide whether to seek the death penalty. Brown refused to comment or media reports that Taylor had said 'no witnesses,' as his reason for shooting the workers after taking 52:300. Most of the money recow

ered at Taylor's house, was in coins, according to the reports.

Aloise set the next hearing for June 26 and remanded the pair with
